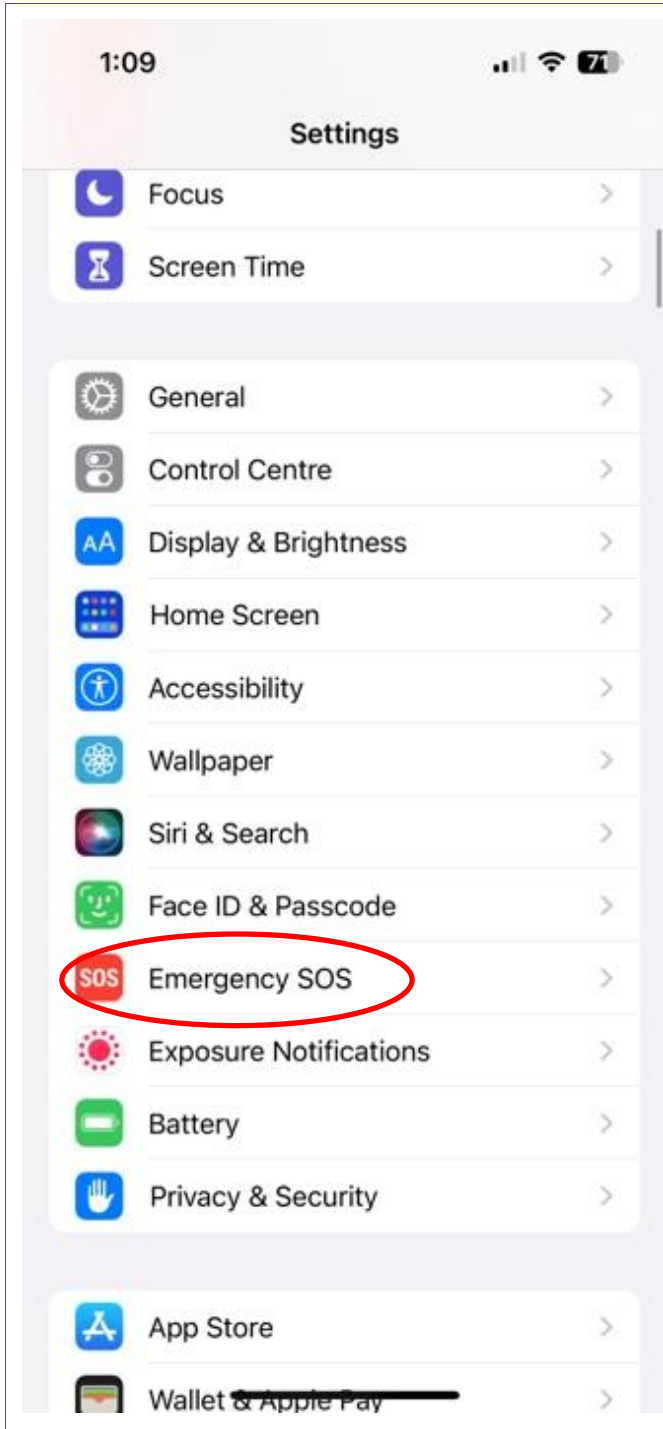

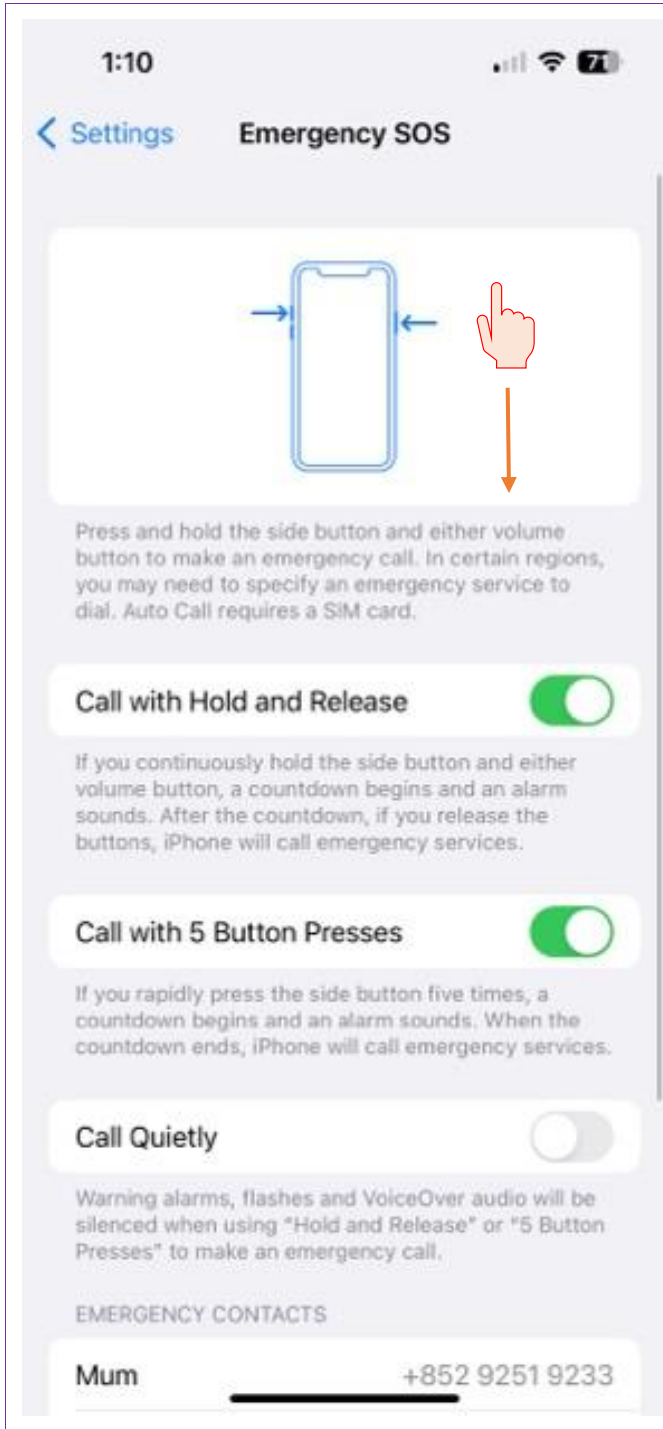

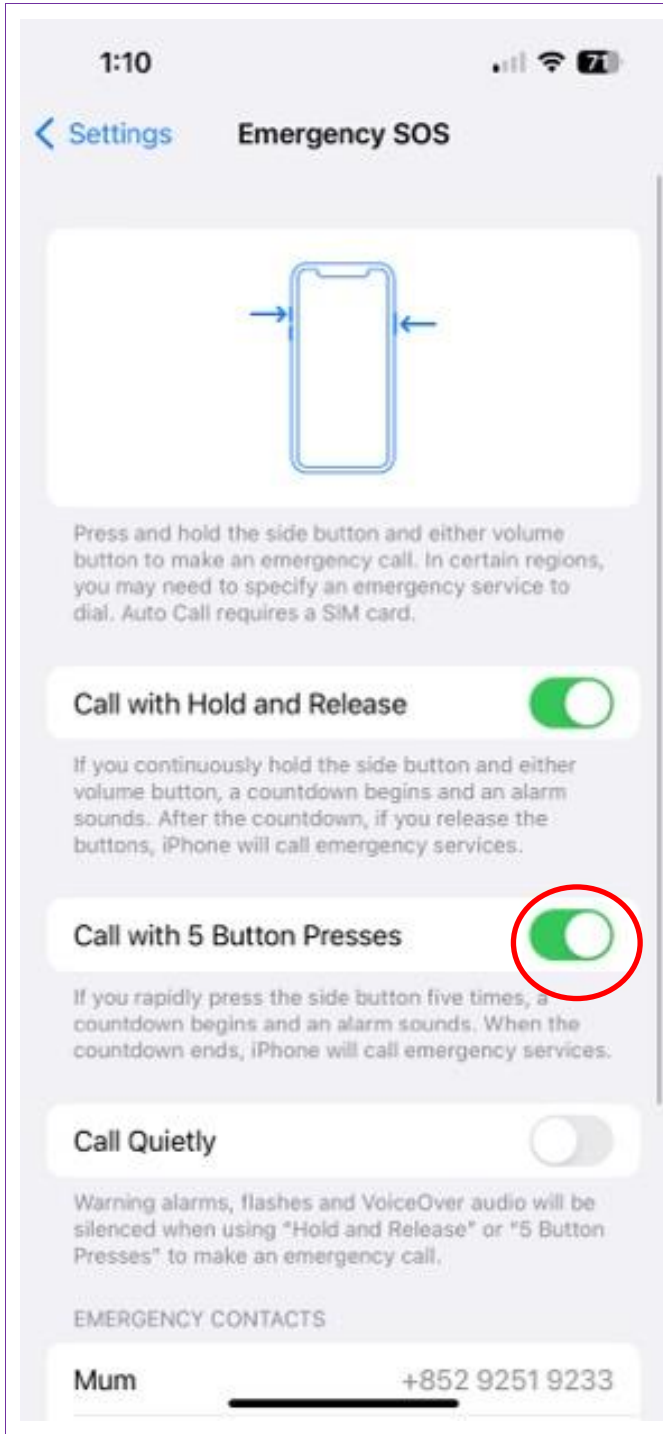

Find the power button on the right side of your phone


Press the button quickly five (5) times

Glossary

App: A program that does a specific task.

Autofill: A feature that remembers your details to make completing forms easier.

Your phone can automatically fill in your details when you log into a website

Your phone can save login details for websites

iOS: An operating system created by Apple.

Medical ID: Medical information paramedics can see if you have an accident.

Operating system: A way of managing digital information.

SOS Call: A feature that makes calling emergency services easier.

Touch ID: A way of unlocking your phone using your fingerprint.
